# Spring 2023 Survey Data Lincoln Public Schools

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# Introduction

Each year we seek out feedback in a variety of ways because it is important to understand the lived experiences of all of our students, families, and staff. Hearing about all community members' experiences helps us to understand our strengths and areas in need of improvement. The survey questions are based on research and model surveys developed by Panorama Education in partnership with the RIDES (Reimagining Integration: Diverse & Equitable Schools) Project at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. Many of the questions support our AIDE (antiracism, inclusion, diversity, and equity) work and will help us to ensure that every individual is valued as a member of our school and district communities.

We conducted specific surveys for: (1) Students in preschool through 8th grade; (2) Families in preschool through 8th grade; (3) Faculty; (4) Instructional Staff, including classroom assistants, special education tutors, and library assistants; and (5) Staff, including secretaries and administrative assistants, food service, facilities, IT/Technology, and bus monitors.

Students in grades 2-8 completed the survey online independently. While there are many overlapping questions, students in grades 2-5 completed a survey that is slightly shorter and with developmentally appropriate vocabulary compared to students in grades 6-8. Kindergarten and first grade students completed the survey on paper with the help of adults who could support their reading. Surveys in preschool were conducted as 1:1 interviews with visual aids.

We use the information gleaned from these surveys alongside other quantitative, qualitative, and observational methods to ensure all community members have an avenue to share their experience and have their voice heard, to gauge the impact of our district-wide and school-based work, and to inform our strategic planning for the next school year. While this is one instrument and set of data points among many, it is an important component of measuring our areas of strength and growth.

There is a significant amount of data included in this report. Many charts utilize heat map color coding to show differences between groups of respondents or between years. If the percentage point differential is positive it is coded as green with increasing saturation for higher numbers. The same is true for negative numbers using orange using the bands below:

# Student Responses

Below are average responses for each category across the four groups of students who took surveys. Some key observations include:

- In general, younger students responded more positively than older students.
- For all grade levels, Engagement was rated the lowest out of all of the categories at 45%.
- Students across all grades reported somewhat similarly to questions about rigorous expectations whereas other categories like Engagement, and School Belonging show a significant range of experiences, with positive responses decreasing by 2/3 between preschool and grades 6-8.

Last year there were not significant differences between the Lincoln campus and the Hanscom campus. This year, while responses in Curriculum, Instruction, & Assessment, School Belonging, and Teacher-Student Relationships were very similar, responses in the other three categories showed bigger differences, with each campus having one or two categories they rated higher or lower than the other campus.

Responses disaggregated by race are quite different than last year. In 2022, White students reported slightly lower rates of positive answers compared to students of color. This year, multiracial non-Latinx students reported consistently lower rates than their peers. Latinx students report three categories to be more positive than their peers and three categories lower. Asian, Black, and Indigenous students (who are combined to protect their anonymity because of the low n-size) have two categories that are significantly higher and one significantly lower than their peers.

Across preschool students, those who identify as female reported slightly more positive experiences than those who identify as male. Responses from students who receive Special Education services and those who do not are relatively similar.

K-1 students who live on Hanscom Air Force Base do not report substantially different experiences than those who live in Lincoln. This is a shift from last year, in which Hanscom students reported more favorably in all categories compared to Lincoln-resident students. Those who live in Boston and children of employees who live in other towns reported lower perceptions in all categories, which is also a change from last year. (In order to protect anonymity due to low n-sizes, these students have been combined so that their data can be included.) When analyzing this trend, it became apparent that Boston-resident students and students from other towns each had categories in which they reported significantly higher or significantly lower from one another.

K-1 students across the district who identify as Latinx reported the highest positive responses consistently across racial groups, which is the same as 2022. Multi-racial, non-Latinx students reported substantially lower experiences around Engagement for the second year in a row. Black students reported significantly lower percentages of positive responses across categories.

Similar to preschool students, K-1 students who identify as male reported slightly more negative experiences, especially around Engagement and Rigorous Expectations. Overall, students who are E, economically disadvantaged, those who have high needs, or have disabilities all report generally more positive experiences, which indicate that these students are getting what they need.



# Longitudinal Changes Grades 2-5



Students who reside on Hanscom and those who are Lincoln-residents report similar experiences across the six categories. Boston-resident students indicated less positive responses across all categories, in particular around School Belonging, Engagement, and Rigorous Expectations.





# Longitudinal Changes Grades 6-8



In the sixth through eighth grades, Boston-resident students report more negative experiences across nearly all categories compared to students who live on Hanscom or in Lincoln. Students of employee children who live in other towns were not included so as to protect their anonymity because their n-size was so small.


Unlike last year, when Black students had more categories at higher levels than those that were negative, this year Black students in grades 6-8 reported significantly less positive experiences in contrast to their peers from other racial groups. Last year, the students with the least positive responses across categories were Latinx, and while responses from Latinx students are slightly lower across all categories, the gap is far less than it was in 2022.

The chart below shows the average percent of positive responses across all six categories of questions from 2021 to 2023 for students in grades 6-8. We acknowledge that there is a bit of noise in the data below for a few reasons, but the general visualization is interesting to see. In particular, this chart raises awareness of the drop from 2022 to 2023 for Black students, which is the largest change across three years for any racial group.



Significantly fewer families completed the survey this year compared to 2022 from all residencies. In particular, the very low n-sizes for Boston-resident families and those living in other towns make these particular data sets volatile and potentially inconsistent. Overall, families from Boston and Hanscom report generally more positive responses than families in Lincoln, which was also the case in 2022.










#### Q.4: How much do you matter to others at work?




## Q.1: How often do you think about what colleagues of different races, ethnicities, or cultures experience?


## Q.2: How confident are you that adults at work can have honest conversations with each other about race?


## Q.3: How comfortable are you discussing race-related topics with your colleagues?


# Q.4: How often do adults at work have important conversations about race, even when they might be uncomfortable?


# Q.5: When there are major news events related to race, how often do adults at work talk about them with each other?
