Hanscom Middle School Bridge Program Proposal

Program Description

The Bridge Program is a flexible program that can serve general and special education students in a wide range of service delivery. This program can provide services ranging from full inclusion to substantially separate programming with the opportunity for inclusion in areas most appropriate to individual student needs-flexibility of programming. It will have the following core program foundations:

- Co-taught instruction with general and special education teacher
 - Lead Teacher would be Special Education Teacher
 - Content Teachers will be Certified in Content Area
- Emotional and Behavioral support and interventions
- Communication, social skills and academic supports to access the general education curriculum for increased opportunity to make effective progress within inclusion setting
- Frequent home communication and individual quarterly progress meetings with providers

There may be no more than 12 students in this program under Special Education Laws and Regulations 603 CMR 28.06 (d) and there cannot be an age range greater than 48 months 603 CMR 28.06 (g).

Bridge Program Student Needs

Students entering the program may have needs in the following areas:

- Specifically designed instruction to access academics
- Development in social skills and pragmatics
- Guidance with navigating social situations
- Assistance to develop skills around middle school transitions in the school day
- Discrete direction around following routines
- Access to support and skill development with emotional and behavioral needs
- Specifically designed instruction for regulating behaviors and/or utilizing coping strategies

Bridge Program Timeline Focus

2023-2024

- Current 7th grade students who required substantially separate programming and significant support to access learning and social-emotional supports
- Focus on core aspects of program development
- Currently determining students who will transition into program for next academic year
 - Students In and New to District

2024-2025

- Programming to fit student need
- Multi-grade level programming
- Focus on ongoing program development and evaluation of programming

Hanscom and Lincoln School Foundations Programs

Program Description

Substantially separate and partial inclusion program with an emphasis on inclusion in areas most appropriate to individual student needs-flexibility of programming

- Instruction outside of the class provided as needed for individual social, emotional and behavioral needs
- 1:1 or small group and/or to preview, review and reinforce academic and social skills for inclusion within the general education setting.
- Specifically designed instruction for emotional and behavioral needs
- Trauma informed instruction as needed
- Communication, social skills and academic supports to access the general education curriculum
- Daily home communication and individual quarterly clinical progress meetings
- 2:1 student-to-staff support model
 - Could be 3:1 depending on student need

NOTE: The cap of students in this program is required to be no more than 12 students under Special Education Laws and Regulations 603 CMR 28.06 (d) and could not have an age range greater than 48 months 603 CMR 28.06 (g).

Foundations Program Student Needs

Students entering the program may have needs in the following areas:

- Specifically designed instruction for regulating emotions and/or utilizing coping strategies
- Specifically designed instruction for behavior to ensure safety for self and others
- Specifically designed instruction to access academics
- Development in social skills and pragmatics
- Guidance with navigating social situations
- Assistance to develop skills around primary school transitions in the school day
- Discrete direction around following routines
- Opportunities for inclusion based on student need

Foundations Program Timeline Focus

2023-2024

- Initial Stages of Program development
 - Focus on students who required substantially separate programming and therapeutic environment
 - Multi-grade level programming
- Currently determining students who will transition into program for next academic year
 - Students In and New to District

2024-2025

- Ongoing programming to fit student need that aligns with general education
- Focus on ongoing program development
- Ongoing consultation for program evaluation
