





#### Categories of Disability LPS 2023




#### Comparison of Disability Categories in 2022 & 2023



- Strong relationships with students and families
- Specifically designed instruction for every student on an IEP that addresses individualized needs
- Improve collaboration, curriculum planning and differentiation for all students
- Special Educators knowledge of grade level curriculum

## Out of District Programming

OOD students requiring programming outside of the district require more intensive programming typically related to social-emotional/behavioral, autism, medical needs/complex learning needs and neurological disabilities (or a combination of needs). The district seeks to place in the LRE (collaboratives) before looking to private day placements.

# CURRENT NEEDS AT HANSCOM SCHOOL

#### Program Description

**Substantially separate and partial inclusion program** with an emphasis on inclusion in areas most appropriate to individual student needs-flexibility of programming

- Instruction outside of the class provided as needed for individual social, emotional and behavioral needs
- 1:1 or small group and/or to preview, review and reinforce academic and social skills for inclusion within the general education setting.
- Specifically designed instruction for emotional and behavioral needs
- Trauma informed instruction as needed
- Communication, social skills and academic supports to access the general education curriculum
- Daily home communication and individual quarterly clinical progress meetings
- 2:1 student-to-staff support model
  - Could be 3:1 depending on student need

NOTE: The cap of students in this program is required to be no more than 12 students under Special Education Laws and Regulations 603 CMR 28.06 (d) and could not have an age range greater than 48 months 603 CMR 28.06 (g).
