Important highlights from student data

- First time including Preschool, K, 1, and 2
- School Belonging was the area that decreased the most for 3-5 graders from last year to this year; and 6-8 graders reported the biggest decline in School Climate.
- Gaps between subgroups are different depending on age range; in some cases, gaps significantly narrowed from last year to this year.
- Boston-resident students report less positive experiences in nearly all categories for grades 2-8 when compared to Lincoln-resident and Hanscom students.

- Specific gaps unique to families (vs. students or staff) are visible:
 - Boston-residents and Hanscom families reported more positive responses than Lincoln-residents overall.
 - Families in Preschool, K, 3, and 5 reported significantly higher rates of positivity compared to those with students in grades 1, 4, 7, and 8.
 - Asian, Multiracial, and families whose race is confidentiality protected reported less positive responses in all categories compared to Black, Latinx, and White families.
