Re: Report on Summer Curriculum and Professional Development

Date: August 30, 2017

Overview

The summer work and learning projects undertaken by LPS faculty in 2017 were numerous. They included large sessions like the Coaching for High-Impact Teams course, which included 52 staff from across the district to small ones, like the four Visual Arts teachers from across the district coming together to incorporate more artists of color throughout their curriculum. The quality of the projects was high and implementation of new learning will commence as early as this upcoming week when students return. Multiple projects were based on revising or deepening existing bodies of work to sustain and strengthen important momentum from the prior school year.

Range of projects

The summer work projects, covering almost all curriculum areas, often involved teams coming together to craft or revisit curriculum, reflect on their instruction, and build a shared vision for the teaching and learning they will be leading in the coming school year. Steven Levy's two-day Integrated Curriculum Writing workshop occurred twice during the summer. Examples of collaborative projects from the workshops included "Integration of Art and Poetry" in the 8th grade and "Large-scale, Multi-disciplinary murals" in Kindergarten at the Lincoln School, as well as "Non-fiction Reading to Support Faces of Inequality" and "Grade 6 Climate Change and Water" at Hanscom. Multiple teams had new team members and these workshops offered opportunities for teams to build shared understanding and trust as they jumped into their work.

Alignment with Strategic Plan and Observations

All summer work conducted by faculty was in alignment with the Strategic Plan and the various projects can be seen on the following page.

During my visits to summer sessions I observed faculty to be focused, productive, and incredibly grateful for the opportunity to engage in work that would improve their professional practice and make an immediate, positive impact for students. I was particularly impressed with the level of reflection, eagerness to share and help colleagues, and passion for creating meaningful learning experiences for young people that I saw across all groups. I am looking forward to seeing the fruits of teams' collaboration in action throughout the year in classrooms all across our district.
