

STUDENT ENROLLMENT

CASE Collaborative started FY24 with 112 students. We had budgeted for 108.

As of September 11, 2024, 55% of the students represented at CASE Collaborative belonged to member towns. Students from non-member districts equate to 45%.

We continue to receive referrals of students in all our strands - social emotional, autism spectrum disorder, and multiple disabilities strand. We look forward to serving increased numbers of students during the course of this school year.

During the summer of 2024, we transported 267 students.

Presently, we have 66 full time drivers. We have several pending applications for potential drivers. We are waiting on CORI, fingerprinting, and 7D licensing for new hires. Sixteen (16) drivers have been hired over the past year. There are 25 drivers with 10+ years of experience. There are 8 drivers with 20+ years.

The total number of vehicles operating at CASE is 90. Out of these, 20 are wheelchair equipped.

Twenty (20) vehicles in CASE's fleet of vans are from the year 2022 or newer.



CONSULTING SERVICES TO DISTRICTS - A NEW INITIATIVE AT CASE

The Board approved a new initiative proposed by CASE in FY24. This approval led to the hire of 1 Director of Consulting Services (at .9 FTE) and 3 part-time Consultants (at .6, .6, and .7 FTE).

The director, Anne Donavan has worked closely with administrators all summer to get the new consulting services team established at CASE. We look forward to introducing this team to the Board and providing an update on the work that has been done so far to establish this service as well as provide projections for the coming months.





CASE School Consulting Services - A New Initiative

SUMMER 2024

CASE's summer (ESY) program was extremely successful. We had 101 students enrolled this summer in our programs. The budget was for 96 students. We were successful in providing services to more students than budgeted.

Staff spent the summer making sure students are maintaining their IEP goals but at the same time, engaging in enriching activities.

CASE's ESY program has been located at The Willard School in Concord for the last 2 years. Our second location was Colebrook School in Acton.

We look forward to continuing our partnership with Concord to host our ESY program for district-based programs. Laurie Hunter (Concord Superintendent), Matt Lucey (Willard Principal)



and the school custodian made sure we had a successful summer. We thank them for their support.
